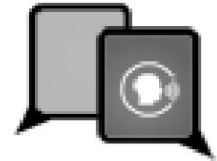

OVERVIEW

Autism is not one syndrome but a spectrum of conditions. This is known as a triad of impairments.

A mindblindness, an inability to achieve attention with others, they become unable to build on that basic step to work out what others are thinking, perceiving, intending, or believing. They become blind to others mental states.
